All State-Approved Substance Use Disorder Programs

Effective October 1, 2020

DLA-20 for Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP) Programs

The DLA-20 outcome measurement tool is a service requirement for the Intensive Outpatient Treatment (IOP) bundled service. In a provider notice dated December 10, 2019, Montana Healthcare Programs issued a temporary hold on enforcement of this requirement to allow providers the opportunity to receive DLA-20 training. The DLA-20 training has now been offered and provided. As such, the temporary hold for the DLA-20 will be lifted effective October 1, 2020, and providers are required to implement the DLA-20 requirement.

The DLA-20 service requirement is described in the Addictive and Mental Disorders Division, Medicaid Services Provider Manual for Substance Use Disorder and Adult Mental Health, <u>Policy Number 525: SUD Intensive Outpatient (IOP) Services (ASAM 2.1) Adult and Adolescent.</u>

DLA-20 for adolescents (members under the age of 21).

The DLA-20 will no longer be required for adolescents effective July 1, 2019, until further notice.
